- Entry Fees are \$4.50 per seat + GST. Fees are to be direct credited to the bank account detailed on page 2.
- Entries open Monday 22 September 2014 and will close at 10.00pm Sunday 5 October 2014. Please note that this is a big boat regatta only with no U15 and Novice events. We will allow plenty of time between races to allow equipment to be used in following events.
- All senior and open events have been combined for this regatta as the open class.
- All regatta entries must be made online using the rowIT entry system. Instructions for using this system are set out on page 3.
- If you require ease of identification and clarity of Clubs/Schools entries for billing seat fees then Clubs/Schools should enter under their own rowIT code. Otherwise please use the entry identification system outlined on page 4.
- School Crews have the option of racing in either Club or School colors. Schools entering the regatta will be identified with their rowIT entry code. (see page 4 for more detail)
- Coxswains weights are to be 55kg for all events. Crews are responsible for their own weights. Spot
 checks will be made by the ARA Representative following races. Crews with underweight coxswains
 will be disqualified.
- Tent sites, as ever, are somewhat restricted at Pupuke. There will be five 'premium' sites (6m x 8m) available with unrestricted water views. Cost of these sites is \$125.00 plus GST (This charge is to assist in offsetting the increasing costs to use Lake Pupuke and the Facilities). These premium sites are limited and will be allocated on a "first received" basis. If you wish to reserve one of these then please indicate so on the entry form, and enclose your payment. Your payment will be refunded if you are unsuccessful.
- PLEASE NOTE bow numbers, based on an alpha numeric system, will be available from the Secretary's caravan, and **MUST** be used to identify crews for each race.

All Auckland Clubs and Schools already have rowlT logins but many will not have used these for several months. It is recommended you contact Andrew Carr-Smith to get your logins updated as required and to make sure you have the setup that suits your club or school. Andrew's contact details are provided below.

Schools should be familiar with this regatta entry system as it is used for NISS and Maadi. Andrew can provide refresher instructions for other users.

As this is the start of a new season clubs will need to update their rosters of athletes before making entries. All rowers who were issued a Rowing NZ license number in recent seasons are already recorded in the rowIT database. All new rowers must be entered into the rowIT system before you make your entries. (Details of these new rowers will not be passed to RowingNZ or the ARA, so season levies will not be charged for these rowers - until they are registered with RowingNZ by their club.)

Andrew has advised that once new rowers are entered it should take approximately 30 to 40 minutes to complete entries for average sized squads.

If you require ease of identification and clarity of Clubs/Schools entries for billing seat fees then Clubs/Schools should enter under their own rowlT code. Otherwise please use the entry identification system outlined on page 4.

Ages for this regatta are based on the Rowing New Zealand Rules of Racing. A rower may row in an age limited event if they are under the specified age limit on 1st January in the season of the regatta - e.g. a rower can compete in an Under 16 event if they are under the age of 16 on 1 January 2015.

Tent site requests should be sent direct to Murray Earl and these will be allocated outside the rowIT regatta entry system.

Crews will be able to be entered into the rowIT regatta entry system from Monday 22 September 2014 and it will close at 10.00pm Sunday 5 October 2014.

If you have a crew that is the only entry in an event but you wish to row them in an easier heat (ability reasons only please) then please allocate a number equivalent to a number 2 or 3 crew (eg AKLC 12) so we can organize the draw accordingly. Unfortunately this situation does not work in the reverse as events with more than one heat will be organized so Number 1 crews compete against Number 1 crews and Number 2 crews compete against number 2 crews.

Composite crews may be entered through rowIT. This is achieved by linking with another entity and bringing their athletes into your squad (then selecting a crew using a mix of those athletes and your own athletes). Composite crews will be identified as belonging to the entity that enters the crew e.g. a crew entered by West End will be a West End Composite.

Scratchings, late entries and substitutions can be made, via the rowIT program, from about lunchtime Monday the 6th of October, up to 5pm Wednesday the 8th October 2014. The race program will be submitted in final form to the program printer on Wednesday 8th October 2014 any changes after that will not be included in the printed program. An amended day sheet will be available to the umpires and the Clubs/Schools where late notifications are not included in the printed programme.

Late entries will only be accepted if there is space in the program, and it does not increase the number of races.

Notes re Mixed Events

- 1. Club mixed class eights maximum of 1 RPC and 2 senior rowers (Events 16 & 20)
- 2. Club mixed sex mixed class eights maximum of 2 RPC (1 male & 1 female) and 2 senior rowers (1 male & 1 female) equal number of men and women rowers in the boat (Event 29)
- 3. Boys & Girls mixed age eights maximum of 3 U18 rowers (Events 22 and 25)
- 4. School mixed sex mixed age eights maximum of 4 U18 rowers (2 male & 2 female) and equal number of men and women rowers in the boat (Event 33)

Please contact Murray Discombe if you wish to enter crews outside these guidelines.

Conditions of Entry

- Events rowed under the NZRA Rules of Racing and Directives for Regattas with special conditions by the ARA.
- 2. Events rowed on approximately 1000m course.
- 3. No. 1 lane position nearest the starter.
- 4. Boats to be identified by fixed alpha numeric bow numbers supplied by the regatta organisers. Boats without a bow number may not be allowed to start.

NOTE: Boat numbers will be supplied by the ARA from the Secretary's caravan.

- 5. Coxwain weight 55kg for all events. Crews are responsible for their own weights. Spot checks will be made by the ARA Representative following races. Crews with underweight coxswains will be disqualified.
- 6. Bow balls must be the correct size and correctly attached.
- 7. Coxwains must wear a New Zealand Safety Standard approved lifejacket.
- 8. Heel restraints must have a maximum 70mm free movement.
- 9. For bow coxed boxed boats there must be an exit facility for coxes.
- 10. Programme alterations may be made to suit the day's weather conditions.
- 11. Umpires and starters may combine races at their discretion.
- 12. Late entries accepted only where numbers permit. Payment must accompany late entries otherwise the crew will not be allowed to start.
- 13. Crews must finish outside the marked buoy anchored close to the finish. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.
- 14. The ARA will mediate any disputes that will arise, and their decision will be binding.
- 15. The ARA will mediate the refunds if the regatta is cancelled. All clubs must pay the entry fees prior to race day.
- 16. The safety meeting held prior to the start of the regatta is compulsory for all club/school reps to attend, and those that do not attend will not be allowed to race until they have received instruction from the officials.
- 17. All competitors and coaches will be required to attend a compulsory safety meeting at 7.15 am on the grass bank in front of the marquees.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR CLUBS

- 1. Only vehicles towing boats and official cars with a parking pass will be allowed entry to the car park. Disabled parking will be available.
- 2. Buses are not permitted in the Park of Sylvan Park Avenue. Please advise buses of this restriction.
- 3. Parking has been restricted in Sylvan Park Avenue as a condition of use of the reserve. Please observe the requests of the regatta marshals.
- 4. Regatta traffic is not permitted into the cul-de-sac past the park gates.
- Auckland Council has advised that vehicles parked on verges or in no parking zones around the Lake will be towed away. Please advise your Club Members as Auckland Council has advised parking restrictions will be actively policed at all Lake Pupuke regattas from 2014/2015 onwards.
- 6. Refer to the Regatta Booklet published by the ARA for the 2013/2014 season for details of the Lake Pupuke venue.
