<u>Rowit</u> All regatta entries must be made online using the rowIT entry system. Instructions for using this system are set out on page 2.

Entries open Monday 24 October 2016 and will close at 10.00pm Friday 11 November 2016.

Racing is scheduled to start at 8:00am.

<u>Tent Sites</u> Tent sites with good views of the course are limited at Lake Pupuke. We are offering to reserve 4 sites (6m x 8m approx) with unrestricted water views at a cost of \$172.50 (or \$150 plus GST) on a first received basis. If you wish to reserve a site then **please email the Regatta Secretary** and once confirmed direct credit our Bank Account.

<u>Boat Park</u> To ensure we can accommodate everyone comfortably within the limited space available in the boat park, spaces will be allocated to each Club based on the size of your squad etc. A map showing allocations will be displayed on the boat park gate area and emailed to Clubs before the event. **Please do not set up your tent until Saturday**. This will ensure ease of access for late comers and avoid the inconvenience of having to take your tent down to allow access. Avoid erecting you tent on access lanes and tree drip lines.

Please note there have been some changes to the race programme and there is a shorter time frame for scratchings and late entries.

We look forward to seeing you and your supporters on Saturday, 19 November for a successful day of racing. Until then, happy training and here's hoping for calm, sunny conditions!

rowIT Online Regatta Entry System: www.rowit.co.nz

All Auckland Clubs and Schools already have rowIT logins. You should contact Andrew Carr-Smith if your logins need updating and to make sure you have the set-up that suits your club or school.

As this is still the start of a new Season clubs may need to update their Roster before making entries.

- Rowers who have been entered in regattas previously are already recorded in the rowIT database.
- All new rowers must be in the rowIT system before you make your entries.

You can either add new rowers directly to the rowIT database. Or you can now add them to the RNZ database as unlicensed or licensed members of your club or school and then import them into rowIT.

New in 2015: rowlT now has the ability to provide <u>dual recognition of both club and school</u>. This can used to supplement the identification of schools using one of the above methods. It is done during entries by recording both school and club for a crew. Details have been provided to rowlT logins holder by Andrew

For ease of identification of Clubs/Schools and clarity in billing seat fees we request Clubs/Schools enter under their own rowIT code. School crews that are entered under a club's code should use double-digit crew numbers for identification.

Crew numbers will be used for seeding crews into divisions. If you are using double-digit crew numbers the second digit is the important one. If you have a crew that is your only entry in an event but you wish to row it in an easier division (ability reasons only please!) then it allocate a higher crew number e.g. AKLC 2, WESC 22, etc.

Composite Crews may be entered through rowlT. This is achieved by linking with another entity and bringing their athletes into your squad (then selecting a crew mix of those athletes and your own athletes). Composite crews will be identified as belonging to the entity that enters the crew e.g. a crew entered by North Shore will be a north Shore composite.

Tent site requests These will be allocated outside the rowlT regatta entry system (see page 1) **Entries** Crews will be able to be entered into the rowlT regatta entry system based on this timing

Conditions of Entry

- 1. Events are rowed under the NZ Rowing Association Rules of Racing and Directives for Regattas with special conditions applied by the ARA.
- 2. Events are rowed on approximately 1000m course.
- 3. Lane 1 is the position nearest the starter.
- 4. All crews must be at the start zone 5 minutes before the actual race time.
- 5. Every rower must wear either their club or school colours.
- Coxswains weights are to be 55kg for all events. Crews are responsible for their own weights. Spot checks will be made by the ARA Representative following races. Crews with underweight coxswains will be disqualified.
- 7. Bow balls must be the correct size and correctly attached.
- 8. Coxswains must wear a New Zealand Safety Standard approved lifejacket.
- 9. In accordance with ARA safety requirements, all boats racing MUST have heel restraints with a maximum of 70mm free movement. Failure to provide these may result in the boat being disqualified from the regatta. Heel restraints must have a maximum 70mm free movement.
- 10. For bow coxed boxed boats there must be an exit facility for coxes.
- 11. Attendance at the safety meeting at 7.15am, on the grass bank in front of the marquees, is compulsory for all Clubs and Schools. Those that do not attend will not be allowed to race until they have received instruction from the officials.
- 12. Programme alterations may be made to suit the day's weather conditions.
- 13. Umpires and starters may combine races at their discretion.
- 14. Boats to be identified by fixed bow numbers.
 - Note, bow numbers will be based on an alpha numeric system and MUST be used to identify crews for each race. These bow numbers will be supplied by the ARA from the Regatta Secretary's NSRC Control tent.
- 15. Late entries accepted only where numbers permit. Payment must accompany late entries otherwise the crew will not be allowed to start.
- 16. Late scratchings must be handed to the Regatta Secretary before the start of the regatta or if crews are scratched during the day they need to be notified well before the race is due to be run during the day.
- 17. Crews must finish outside the marked buoy anchored close to the finish. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.
- 18. The ARA will mediate any disputes regarding racing, and their decision will be binding.
- 19. All Clubs must pay entry fees and tent site fees prior to race day. In the event of the regatta being cancelled, the ARA will mediate any refunds.
- 20. Regional Performance Centre's may enter crews in any Open class events.
- 21. Ages for this regatta are based on the Rowing New Zealand Rules of Racing. The age-group reference date is 1 January 2016. A rower may row in an age limited event if they are under the specified age limit on 1 January 2016 e.g. a rower can compete in an Under-15 event if they are under the age of 15 on 1 January 2016.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SCHOOLS & CLUBS

- Only vehicles towing boats and official cars with a parking pass will be allowed entry to the car park.
 Limited disabled parking is available.
- The Boat Park will be open on Friday 20th November from 3pm-6pm, and on Saturday from 6am. Security will be provided by the organisers on Friday evening to Saturday morning.
- Buses are not permitted in the Park of Sylvan Park Avenue. Please advise buses of this restriction.
- Parking has been restricted in Sylvan Park Avenue as a condition of use of the reserve. Please observe the requests of the regatta marshals.
- Car parking suggestions Henderson Park and local side streets. Please note the Mall car park is patrolled.
- Regatta traffic is not permitted into the cul-de-sac past the park gates.
- For safety reasons, the boat park should only be used by rowing squad members, coaches and officials. Spectators should be encouraged to stay out of the boat park area.
- Auckland Council has signalled their intention to strictly enforce parking restrictions around Lake Pupuke during the regatta. In particular any vehicles parked on verges or designated no parking zones will be automatically towed.
- Refer to the Regatta Booklet published by the ARA for the 2013/2014 season for details of the Lake Pupuke revenue.
