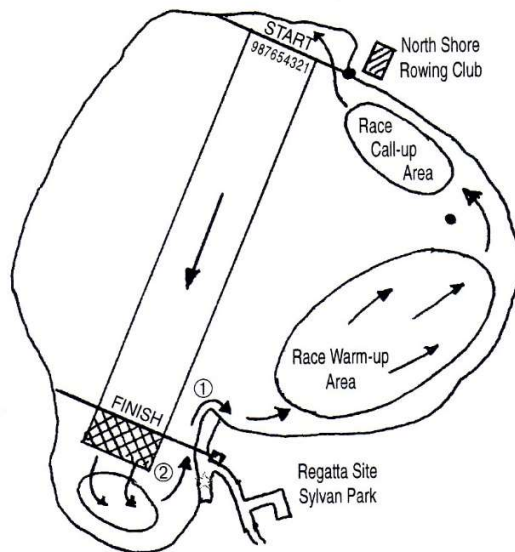

"On-the-Water" Rules



Any crew finishing between the buoy and the Point may be disqualified.

*Launch at "1"
**Retrieve at or to the left of "2"

☆Launch and retrieval area - keep clear at all times

***Launching and retrieving may be changed depending on weather conditions

Safety at Head of the Harbour Regatta

Safety Briefing

A representative from each school MUST attend the safety briefing being held by zoom at 7.30pm Thursday 10 February 2022.

A roll call will be made of all competing schools - No Show, No Racing. No Excuse.

Before you load your boats to come to Lake Pupuke, please check the following:

- Bow ball – if it is not great, NOW is the time to get it replaced.
- Coxswain egress – in event of a capsize, make sure the cox can get out.
- Heel restraints – will not permit heels to exceed a horizontal position.
- A single quick release cords on your shoes. **(no laces permitted)**
- Life jackets which are serviceable and fit for purpose.

Check, Check, Check your boat before bringing it down to launch on water. Crews presenting non-complaint boats will be sent back to the boat park for the boats to be made compliant.

Non-compliant may mean you miss your race!

1. The coxswain weight is 55kg. If you are carrying extra weight, have this secure in a bag, close to the coxswain. 20kg is the maximum weight which can be carried.
2. Coxswain's will not be weighed at this regatta but any coxswains not carrying weights will be asked by an official where are they at the launch pontoon.
3. Numbers will be issued by officials when you bring your boat down to be launched. The exception is crews rowing out of the North Shore shed who will be given their numbers at the start of the days racing.
4. Boats and "On Water"
 - Be organised as you put your boat in the water.
 - Allow enough time to get to the start.
 - Be with other crews who have the same bow **letter** as you.
 - Know what crew you are and what race you are in, and what the start time is – write this on your hand if need be.
 - Be alert and listen to the instructions of all officials. **(especially important in start area)**
5. Traffic Circulation – understand your route to the start. The circulation pattern is anti-clockwise. Practice starts are expressly not permitted anywhere on Lake Pupuke.
6. Race Time – assume your race will start at the advertised time unless advised otherwise.
7. Start
 - Each lane is shared by more than 1 boat – your lane is against the buoy line nearest your boat.
 - Be positioned to row onto the start line, in descending order i.e. the outside lane goes 1st, 8,7,6 etc, immediately the previous race begins.
 - Row onto the start line and turn there. **DO NOT try to back into the start.**
 - Listen carefully and do what the starter says.
 - Lane 1 is nearest the North Shore Rowing Club.
8. React quickly to any instruction from the race umpire – they are there for your safety, and the fairness of the race.
9. Should you capsize during the race, stay with your boat.
10. Row right through the finish – **do not** stop on the finish line and risk getting T boned! Crews are to proceed immediately to the off-water area to take their boats off the water.
11. Please return bow numbers immediately boats are off the water to the official in the off-water area.
12. **FOUL LANGUAGE** is not acceptable and will be dealt with accordingly, NZ Rowing Assn rules of Racing see rule 74 and rule 75.
