- Entries must be made online via the rowIT entry system.
- Entries open Monday November 16 and close 10pm on Sunday November 29.
- Late entries will be accepted until 8pm on Thursday December 3.
- Entries can be submitted through Clubs or Schools.
- Points will go from this regatta to the Waitemata Shield.
- The lunch break is flexible and may be used to bring the regatta back on time.
- Boat park: the car park area adjacent to the clubhouse is reserved for boats and boat trailers. Parking is provided in the paddock behind the Mercer clubrooms. *No parking on the road on the Mercer side please it is a 100kph zone and heavily loaded trucks cannot stop quickly once they come around the bend and down the hill.*
- This regatta will be conducted under NZRA rules.
- Racing is scheduled to start at 8.00am.
- Safety meeting at 7.15am for all clubs/schools

Auckland Clubs and Schools already have rowIT logins. If your Club/School needs to change its login holder, or needs help with entries, contact Andrew Carr-Smith: andrew@rowit.co.nz

Clubs/Schools must make sure their rowIT Roster of athletes is up to date before making entries. Rowers who have been entered in regattas previously are already in the rowIT database. All new rowers must be in the rowIT database before you make your entries.

You can either add new rowers directly to the rowIT database, or you can add them to RNZ's database as <u>unlicensed or licensed</u> members of your Club/School then import into rowIT.

For ease of identification of Clubs/Schools and clarity in billing fees we request Clubs/Schools enter under their own rowIT code. School crews entered under a club's code should use double-digit crew numbers for identification.

- Auckland Rowing Club (AKLC 1-9): Sacred Heart College (SHAK or AKLC 11-19); Epsom Girls Grammar (EGGS or AKLC 22-29); Diocesan School for Girls (DIOC or AKLC 31-39)
- North Shore Rowing Club (NSHC 1-9): Westlake Boys (WTLB or NSHC 11-19); Westlake Girls (WTLG or NSHC 21-29); Carmel College (CARM or NSHC 31-39), Wentworth College (WENT41-49 or NSHC 41-49)
- St Georges Rowing Club (SGEC 1-9): Macleans College (MACL or SGEC 11-19); Edgewater College (EDWT or SGEC 21-29); Glendowie College (GLDW or SGEC 31-39)
- West End Rowing Club (WESC 1-9): Baradene College (BARA or WESC 11-19); St Peters College (STPA or WESC 21-29); Mt Albert Grammar (MTAL or WESC 31-39)
- If other Clubs/Schools wish to be separately identified they should contact Andrew.

New in 2015: rowIT now has the ability to provide dual recognition of both club and school. This can be used to supplement the identification of schools using one of the above methods. It is done during entries by recording both school and club for a crew. Details have been provided to rowIT logins holder by Andrew

Crew numbers will be used for seeding crews into divisions. If you are using double-digit crew numbers the second digit is the important one. If you have a crew that is your only entry in an event but you wish to row it in an easier division (ability reasons only please!) then allocate it a higher crew number e.g. AKLC 2, WESC 22, etc.

Composite crews may be entered through rowIT. This is achieved by linking with another entity and bringing their athletes into your squad (then selecting a crew mix of those athletes and your own athletes). Composite crews will be identified as belonging to the entity that enters the crew e.g. a crew entered by North Shore will be a North Shore composite.

Entry dates: crews will be able to be entered into the rowIT regatta entry system as follows:

- Entries Open: Monday 16 November 2015
- Entries Close: Sunday 29 November 2015 10pm
- Scratchings, Late Entries* & Substitutions Open: Monday 30 November around noon
 - Scratchings, Late Entries* & Substitutions Close: Thursday 3 December 2015 8pm **
 - * Late entries will only be accepted if there is space in the programme.
 - ** After this time, any entry changes must be submitted to the Regatta Secretary on morning of the regatta.

We will try to provide you a day sheet on Tuesday night before the regatta to check entries. All entries made after Tuesday night will not be included in the printed programme.

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REGATTA CONDITIONS

RULE APPLICATION: All events will be rowed in accordance with the rules of the NZRA and the ARA.
DISTANCE OF RACES: The distance of all events will be approximately 1500 metres upstream with the finish in front of the Mercer clubhouse. Lane 1 is closest to the clubhouse bank. There will be no held starts.
REGATTA DATE: This Regatta is a one day Regatta only and will start at 8.00 am on Sat Dec 6th 2014.
WATER TRAFFIC RULES: All crews must proceed to the start as directed. There will be traffic lanes which must not be crossed. Crews must not proceed to the start on the course or across the course at any stage during the Regatta. Crews must be above the start zone at least 5 minutes before the advertised start time of their race.
BOAT NUMBERS: All boats must carry one of the supplied alpha numeric numbers indicating the race and lane number as shown in the programme. Numbers must be placed on the boat to be read from the Judges side of the course at the finish and must be returned to the regatta secretary after each race.

6. COXSWAINS WEIGHTS: The minimum weight for all coxswains is 55 kg. To make up this weight, dead weight to the maximum of 20 kg shall be carried in the boat. Coxswains may be required to weigh in for the Regatta and they must ensure that they are on or above the minimum weight. They may be check weighed at the conclusion of any race in which they are competing and if found to be below the minimum weight, the crew will be liable to disqualification from that event. Coxswains must wear a NZ Safety Std approved lifejacket.

7. BOW BALLS must be carried by all boats. HEEL RESTRAINTS must have a maximum of 50 mm free movement. BOW COXED BOATS must allow easy egress for the coxswain. If a safety sheet is not signed and presented by the start of racing then that club can not race. Spare sheets available on the day.

8. DIVISIONS: There will be a maximum of 7 boats in any race. Where there are more than 7 entries, races will be run in divisions. Where there are insufficient entries, Mercer Rowing Club reserves the right to alter or cancel any event as necessary.

9. SCRATCHINGS: Scratchings for all events must be lodged with the Regatta Secretary by 7.30 am on Saturday December 5th. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Regatta Secretary, and will incur no extra fee.

10. DISPUTES & REFUNDS: The regatta is run under the control of the ARA. Any disputes will be mediated by the ARA and their decision will be binding. Any protests lodged on the day will incur a fee of \$100. The ARA will mediate refunds if the regatta is cancelled. All clubs must pay the entry fees PRIOR to race day. 11. SAFETY: the safety meeting prior to the start of the regatta at 7.15 am is compulsory for all clubs rowing. Those who do not attend will not be allowed to race until they have received instruction by officials.

12. EXCLUSION OF ALL TORT LIABILITY OF WHATSOEVER KIND: The Auckland Rowing Association Inc. reminds Rowing Clubs and rowers participating in this Regatta that while every care will be taken by the Regatta Officials to ensure that the Regatta is conducted safely and efficiently, and in accordance with the Rules of Racing established by the New Zealand Rowing Association Inc. and/or amended by the Auckland Rowing Association Inc.

It is the responsibility of Clubs to ensure that those rules are complied with and of rowers to comply with them to ensure safe rowing activity.

Further it is a condition of participation in this Regatta that all participants accept and note that no liability either in tort or any other nature whatsoever is accepted by, or will attach to the New Zealand Rowing Association Inc. or the Auckland Rowing Association Inc. for any harm, damage, loss, costs, expenses, inconvenience, interference of whatever nature and whatever kind, including any damage to equipment or injury to persons of

whatever nature incurred in the course of, or in connection with, or in any way related to the Regatta, regardless of whether any error or omission, wrongdoing, oversight, negligence, or other tort whatsoever on the part of any Regatta Official, or other person, may be established.
