Whanganui Rowing Association in conjunction with the Aramoho Whanganui Rowing Club (AWRC) event format for the North Island Interprovincial regatta to be held on the afternoon of 09 October 2021

- 1. The regatta to run from 2.30 pm Saturday afternoon 09 Oct through until approximately 5.00pm
- 2. Competitors will be in two classifications;
 - U 20 team Members Up to 8 male and 8 female rowers with no weight restrictions. The team members are to be under 20 on the 01 Jan 2022 Coxswains will be required
 - Open Team Members up to 8 male and 8 female rower with no weight restrictions. Coxswains will be required
- 3. Boat classes Coxed Four, Coxless quad and Eight+ for each classification
- 4. Associations may enter more than one team
- 5. Woman's and Men's Eights races will be run over 1750 meters. In the event that there are in total no more than six entries across men and woman then the organisers may run both classifications in one race
- 6. Coxed fours and Coxless quads will be run over 1000m
- 7. All starts will be rolling with Lanes numbering from the Aramoho bank. Alpha numbers provided
- 8. Races will be run at approximately 10 minute intervals on the Whanganui river championship course with all finishes directly opposite the Whanganui Rowing Association canteen
- 9. Any association unable to form big boat crews may join with another association, at the discretion of WRAssn. Any association entering multiple teams cannot merge with another association.
- 10. The province with the highest total of points will be awarded the Graeme Moran Trophy
- 11. Points will be awarded on a per association basis to the first boat representing their association. Points will be accrued on 5, 3, 1 basis. No further boats will accrue points.
- 12. In the event of inclement weather the regatta will be moved to Sunday the 10th October start time 10-30am, after the completion of the Whanganui Rowing Associations Winter series Tonks 6km race.

- 13. Entries close 10pm Monday 27th Sept 2021
- 14. Entry must be emailed on the provided entry form to; Whanganuirowing@gmail.com.
- 15. Entry fees to be invoiced by the Whanganui Rowing association directly to each participating association. The fees are \$300.00 plus GST per association.

16. Hosting;

- It is anticipated that each association will bring approximately 16 to 20 competitors however it is possible that larger associations may bring two squads and therefore maybe up to 32 competitors. This assumption is based upon and 8+ being broken down into either one of the two fours. Thus giving each competitor two races.
- It is therefore anticipated that there will be approximately 100+ competitors
- AWRC and the WRASSN will open their facilities for showering/ changing
- AWRC will host a buffet/ BBQ type meal from 6.00pm until 7.00pm for all athletes, coaches and supporters. The cost pp at \$15.00 per head.
- AWRC and the WRAssn will host the trophy presentation at approximately 7.00pm
- AWRC will operate a bar for those of appropriate age. The bar will operate from 5.30pm until 9.00pm.
- AWRC will co-ordinate the regatta draw and print a day sheet
- AWRC encourage visiting associations to signal their intent when paying their association entry fee to have X numbers attend the buffet meal and prize giving to assist with catering and organisational purposes.
