

1 STANDARDS

All events shall be rowed according to the NZRA Rules of Racing, Regulations for Regattas and Directives, and the Conditions of South Island Rowing Inc.

This Regatta is sanctioned regatta under the water safety code of Rowing NZ and an exemption from the requirements of MSA 91 for competitors [excluding coxswains] to wear flotation aids has been granted.

2 SAFETY

Any use of the lake is subject to the Maritime Safety Authority Rules and Regulations and Environment Canterbury Inland Waters Navigation Safety Bylaws 2005 & subsequent amendments.

NOTE: Non-compliance leads to penalties

Rowing, by its very nature has an element of danger associated with it and it is a responsibility of all participants to ensure that safe practices are to be used at all times. SIR safety equipment is available for the regatta only. The Safety requirements are defined in the SIR Safety and Risk Management Document. The Safety policies and practices for rowing at this regatta are included in the New Zealand Rowing safety documents. (www.rowingnz.com) All participants need to be familiar with the safety documents mentioned above.

3 FLAG SIGNALS

Green: Regatta is on. **Yellow:** Regatta is temporarily postponed.

Red: Course Closed Blue: Regatta is abandoned

4 SAFETY MEETING

The safety briefing will be held in the McRae Lounge on Saturday **February 2nd, 2013 at 6.30 a.m.** A representative of each club or school competing must attend and will be responsible to convey any detail from the safety briefing to the competitors and coaches of that club or school. A roll call will be held and any club or school failing to attend may **not be permitted to start**.

5 DISTANCE

The course is a 2000-meter lane Albano course with markers at every 500m and lanes 1-8. Eight lanes will be used for all events.

6 TIME

The regatta will commence on Saturday February 2nd, 2013 at 7:30 a.m.

7 NUMBERS

All boats must carry the correct numbers. Alphanumeric numbers will be provided from the numbers hut close to the launching area. They have to be returned immediately after the race. Failure to return the number will result in a charge of NZD 10.00 per number not returned. The number displayed must be that designated in the draw and must read correctly to Judges during racing. No other numbers will be permitted.

8 PROCEEDING TO START

All crews must proceed to the start on the inside of the course unless specifically directed (see Rowed Code). Crews must not proceed to the start on the course or cross the course when a race is in progress.

Crews must be in the START zone at least five minutes before the advertised start time of their race. The race will take place without reference to absentees. The starter will inform the crews of the time remaining before the start at appropriate intervals.





9 START PROCEDURE

Crews are to be held in their positions two minutes before the start time. Crews arriving late (less than 2 minutes) but before the start of the race automatically incur a penalty false start. Crews arriving after start time are liable to disqualification.

THE START AREA IS A QUIET ZONE

The starting commands are stipulated in Rule 23 in the NZRA Rules of Racing.

10 NON-START RETURNS

For safety reasons, non-starters must return to the boat park outside lane 8 of the regatta course as directed.

11 RACING COLOURS

Every competitor (excluding coxswain) must wear a uniform in club colours. T-shirts or long sleeved sweatshirts may be worn uniformly under the official club uniform provided that the colour is the same as the body of the official club uniform or white. School and RPC crews may race in their specific colours. The Race Committee or Umpire may authorise the wearing of an alternative singlet and/or undergarment in case of adverse weather. Prior agreement for any variation is essential.

12 MEDALS

The members of the first, second and third placed crews of 'A' Finals will receive medals. Medals can be collected from the McRae Lounge.

In the event of finals not being run, medal allocation will be based on the heat times.

13 COXSWAINS

All coxswains must wear an approved type of Life Jacket at all times during racing or training. The life-jacket is to be suitable for the coxswain's size and weight, and worn outside all other clothing. Self-inflating or automatic-inflating life-jackets are not acceptable. Penalty for non-compliance will result in the crew being removed from the race or possibly the event.

Coxswains are not to wear heavy cotton clothing (such as jeans or sweatshirts) but suitable clothing that will keep them warm if they become wet – for example, polypropylene garments, polar fleeces etc.

Coxwains are to provide their own dead weights (if required) and for each coxswain these are to be secured or contained in one package which is clearly identifiable as dead weight. This may be check weighed at any time. Spanners and other tools are not acceptable as dead weight. If inadequate weight is carried in a race, the crew will be subject to being relegated to last place in that race or, other appropriate penalty imposed by the race committee.

Coxswains shall be weighed in rowing costume not less than one hour and not more than two hours before their first race on each day of racing. Thereafter they may be weighed prior to each race in which they are competing. Refer NZRA Rule 15.5

14 PROTESTS

Any objections shall be made to an Umpire, Judge or member of the Race Committee before leaving the boat, except in unavoidable circumstances. The protest shall be confirmed in writing immediately afterwards to the Race Committee and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$20. This shall be forfeited if the protest is not upheld.

15 REPECHAGES & PETITE FINALS

Repechages will not be rowed. 'B' finals will be rowed if deemed appropriate by the Race Committee.





16 SUBSTITUTES

Substitutes are subject to NZRA Rule 16 and must be advised to the Regatta Control via the Regatta Secretary prior to the first race for the event in which the crew is entered.

17 SCRATCHINGS

All day one scratchings must be advised in writing to the Regatta Secretary by 10:00 AM or for earlier races, 30 minutes before the race start. Entry Fees for scratchings will not be refunded. All crews racing on day one, who qualify for racing on day two, are expected to race on day two, however scratchings are permitted without penalty if they are advised to the Regatta Secretary within one hour after the qualifying round has been completed.

A Penalty Fee, as described in Clause 19 below, will be charged for all crews who fail to notify the Regatta Secretary of their intentions regarding changes, or who having progressed through the heats fail to race on day two.

18 TRAINING

Any crew training on the lake during the event must be accompanied by a suitably equipped motor boat (as defined in the Rowing NZ Safety documentation). Crews wishing to train on the lake must comply with the Maritime Safety Authority (MSA) and Environment Canterbury (ECAN) Rules, be within the allowable area of the lake (see map) and Coxswains must wear their life jackets while training. The SIR Safety and Risk Management Plan applies.

NO training will be allowed on the Lake during the Regatta.

19 FEES

The entry fee is \$9.80 per seat excluding coxswain (but including the NZRA Levy). A late scratching fee of \$40 and a failure to progress fee of \$50 will apply as necessary. GST at 15% is to be added to all fees and charges.

20 DISCLAIMER

South Island Rowing Inc reminds all rowing organisations and rowers participating in this Regatta that while every care will be taken by the regatta officials to ensure that the regatta is conducted safely and efficiently in accordance with the Rules of Racing established by the New Zealand Rowing Association, it is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that those rules are complied with and of the rowers to comply with them to ensure safe rowing activity.

Further, it is a condition of participation in this regatta that all participants accept and note that no liability either in tort or any other nature whatsoever is accepted by or will attach to the New Zealand Rowing Association Inc or South Island Rowing Inc for any harm, damage, loss, costs, expenses, inconvenience, interference of what ever nature and whatever kind including any damage to equipment or injury to persons of whatever nature incurred in the course of or in connection with or in any way related to the regatta regardless of whether any error or omission, wrongdoing, oversight, negligence or other tort whatsoever on the part of any regatta official or other person may be established.

Clubs are reminded that A Finals will run in 10 minute intervals. It is therefore necessary to have enough boats to ensure crews do not come late to the start. For the health of the rower it is recommended not to enter more than 3 races with at least 1 hour between two races.

Rowers are reminded that random drug testing may be undertaken during this regatta by the New Zealand Sports Drug Agency.

25 BOAT WASHING

In response to the Didymo Bio-security Hazard it is a requirement that all boats and oars must be washed with detergent when entering into the boat park and when leaving the boat park. Facilities are available for this and your cooperation is appreciated.

26 NOTES

- Where more than one class is included in the same event, it will be rowed in divisions (Masters should indicate men or women).
- The event timing for each race in this regatta is critical and Clubs are expected to provide sufficient boats to avoid timing clashes.
- In completing the entry forms the essential items are the crewmember's Competition Licence number and the event number they are entering. No Licence Number, No Entry!
- NO cell phones or other electronic communication devices (capable of permitting communication with anyone outside the boat) are permitted to be carried in a boat whether switched on or off.
- It is recommended that in order to keep regatta entries to a reasonable and practical level no rower should be entered in more than four events. If regatta entry numbers are excessive consideration will be given to declining entries where any individual rowers are entered in more than four events.
