Hosted by Wanaka Rowing Club Friday 26th - Saturday 27th April 2024

History

In 1998, Port Chalmers Rowing Club held their 125-year celebration with a regatta predominantly for masters. Following the success of this event, it was decided that an annual South Island masters rowing regatta would be held and would be called **The South Island Masters Rowing Championships**. The first official regatta was at Kerrs Reach in 1999 and now rotates annually around each province. The event is now in its 24th year.

Further details

Thursday 25th April 2024 (ANZAC Day)

Crews and boat trailers arrive. Arrive from 3.30pm on. Please avoid arriving earlier as we do not have access to the site until then. We will be in attendance to assist with trailer parking for each club. Please follow our directions. The regatta will take place at Glendhu Bay Campground. On entry to the campground turn left and drive past reception office and over the small bridge. We will be there to meet you and guide you to your parking space.

You will see below, a map showing where the boats can be parked. Each club will be allocated a trailer parking area. This will be determined after registrations closes and numbers are known. Club tents can be erected at the front of their trailer sites. The shorefront will be limited to pedestrians only. No motorized vehicles will be allowed. Head Quarters for the Regatta will be at the 'Lodge'. This will be the Regatta headquarters for the weekend. (Also shown on the map.) Please note we have lots of space available so you will have room for your trailer, club tents and your boats being rigged and set up on dumps.

Crews and boat trailers leave. Please have all trailers and gear removed from Glendhu Bay Campground, by 10am.

The Race Venue – Glendhu Bay, Wanaka

All racing will be held in the Glendhu Bay area. Whilst we have council permission to run this Regatta, we are required to allow passage for the public to access and utilize the bay. Please be mindful of other craft in the area. We will do what we can to minimize the effects for our competitors.

We are using the property of Glendhu Bay Campground as our land base. Please be mindful that there are other guests in the camp.

We have the local Lion's Club providing a fundraising BBQ for both Friday and Saturday, and we have our local coffee cart expert, Menlove Berries, also on hand. These are both on a user pay basis.

Boat launching and return

All clubs will have direct access to the lake front from their club areas. As you know, there is a lot of traffic in this area, please keep lake access as clear as possible and be patient!

Long distance race – On Friday, we ask that you all attend the safety briefing at 7.30am. We expect boats to start taking the water from 8.00am to give everyone time to get out to the starting point of the race. There will be a boat at the start line. Please note, as mentioned in the SIM 2024 Conditions, no training is allowed on the course within half an hour of the start or after the finish of the racing day. The start will be progressive and depend on the number of entries. We will notify you of this at the safety briefing.

1,000m races. Please enter/exit at your given allocation. Move in an anti clockwise circulation pattern, (when rowing to the start line stay close to the shore on the shore side of the buoy line). The course will be 1,000m running as per the maps below. Once you have finished your race, please move away as quickly as possible from the finish area. Ensure you go around the lake side of the red and black buoy at the end of the course.

We have the option of two courses within the bay, dependent on the weather. See below, Course 1 & 2. In addition, you will see the long distance course map. Course 1 will be the fine weather course. Couse 2 will be the alternate course.
