## 2022 WELLINGTON PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS REGATTA CONDITIONS

**DATE:** 10 December 2022 **PREFERRED VENUE**: Korokoro, 2000m **RESERVE DAY:** 11 December 2022 **POINTS TROPHY**: various (see list)

- The regatta will be conducted under the Rules of the NZRA, NZSSRA and the WRA.
- 2. The regatta will also be conducted in accordance with NZRA's Competition Safety Code and WRA's Risk Management Plan.
- 3. The regatta is run over 2000m (or as near as prevailing safety conditions allow).
- 4. Events, as advertised in the regatta programme, will be rowed in classes. Novice and Intermediate classes are according to NZRA Rules.
- 5. Entry fees (excl GST): 1X, \$5; 2X/2-, \$15; 4X±/4±, \$25; 8+/8X+, \$45. WRA will invoice clubs.
- 6. Competitors must hold a current NZRA Competition License in order to enter the regatta.
- 7. The following entry restrictions are in force:
  - a. Unclassified competitors are ineligible for Singles, Doubles, Pairs
  - b. Novice rowers are ineligible for Singles, Pairs
  - c. Intermediate rowers are ineligible for Pairs
  - d. Each competitor is limited to rowing a maximum of three events.
- 8. Composite crews may be entered in any event. They will be identified by the club of entry. <u>WRA does not require Local Association approval of composite crews.</u>
- 9. Dual entity recognition is available for acknowledging schools. Schools can only be recorded during entry. All crew members must be students in the school's roster before the option is available.
- 10. All entries are to be made online via rowlT.
  - a. Entries close 10:00pm, Tuesday 29 November 2022.
  - b. Late entries close 10:00pm, Monday 5 December 2022.
  - c. Supplementary entries close 10:00pm, Thursday 8 December 2022.
  - d. Crews can be altered or scratched online until 11:30am, Friday 9 December 2022.
- 11. Scratchings after the online system closes must be notified to Regatta Control at least 20 minutes before scheduled race start. Five regatta points will be deducted for each unscratched non-starting crew.
- 12. Where less than three entries have been received for an event the event may be cancelled.
- 13. Where more than six entries have been received for an event divisions may be rowed.
  - a. Unless otherwise advised, crews will be drawn according to entry ranking with #1 crews in first division for their class. Clubs should self-seed their crews by crew number.
  - b. Regatta Control may amalgamate divisions or events when scratchings reduce the field.
- 14. Control Commission will be operating.
- 15. Failure to comply with any of the following will result in immediate exclusion of the crew:
  - a. All boats must be fitted with a bow ball that complies with NZRA Rules.
  - b. Coxswains must correctly wear an approved personal floatation device.
  - c. Where coxswains are carrying weights, these must not be attached to the body.
- 16. Coxswains must weigh in 1-2 hours before their first race. The minimum weight for coxswains is 55kg. Any crew found in breach of this condition will be relegated to finish last in its race.
- 17. Crews are to wear their registered club uniform.
- 18. Boat alpha-lane numbers (as per the day sheet) must be displayed at the bow and be legible to the judges on the shore. Lane 1 is the lane nearest the Judges at the finish.
- 19. The Weather Committee will make a decision around midday Friday 9 December about whether or not the regatta goes ahead and what course the regatta will be held on.
- 20. The Regatta Committee reserves the right to alter starting times.
- 21. Crews proceeding to the start are to keep well clear of the course and follow instructions given from umpire and safety boats.
- 22. Crews must be in the Start Zone (within 50m from the start line) at least five minutes prior to the scheduled starting time.
- 23. Races shall start without reference to absentees.
- 24. Umpires may remove any crew from the course where its safety is deemed at risk.
- 25. Any race protest is to be made to the Race Umpire at the conclusion of the race.
- 26. Any appeal is to be made in writing to the Race Committee and accompanied by a \$50 deposit.

- 27. Regatta points (per race). 1<sup>st</sup>, four points; 2<sup>nd</sup>, two points; 3<sup>rd</sup>, one point. Except, a crew that places last in its race is ineligible for points.
- 28. **Points will be deducted** from crews failing to comply with these conditions.
- 29. Potential ties are first resolved in favour of the club that had the fewest points deducted. Then resolved in favour of the club that accrued its points with the fewest crews. If still unresolved a tie is declared.
- 30. WRA will not take responsibility for damage to plant or equipment at the regatta.
