## Karāpiro Memorial Regattas

## Regatta Notice

- 1. **Regatta Dates:** The event is a two-day event consisting of two single day regattas and shall commence at 6am on Saturday 18 November 2023 and shall continue through to the conclusion of racing on Sunday 19 November 2023.
- Regatta Venue: The regatta shall be held at the Mighty River Domain, 601 Maungatautari Road, Lake Karāpiro, Cambridge.
- 3. Regatta Status and Structure:
  - a. This regatta is a **Local Regatta** as defined by clause 1.3.c of the New Zealand Rowing Association Incorporated (NZRA) Rules of Racing 2023 (Rules).
  - b. Whilst the regatta is being held over two days, the event shall be constructed as two single day regattas with the same programme run each day.
  - c. Entities do not have to enter both days but may choose to race one day only. Entities may enter different crews and events each day.
- 4. Generally: The regatta will be conducted in accordance with the <u>Rules</u> except as now modified (as provided for in Rule 6.1 of the Rules) by Karāpiro Rowing Incorporated (KRI) in these conditions or by the Race Committee in exceptional circumstances on the day, and then only in the interests of safety and welfare of competitors, officials and volunteers, and/or fair competition.
- 5. **Distance of Races:** The distance of all races shall be 2000m.
- 6. **Course Description:** All races will be held on a buoyed 9 wire, 8 lane, straight course with a held start. The water for all intents and purposes is to be considered as still and without flow.
- 7. **Minimum Number of Entries:** If, at the close of entries, there are 3 entries or less in any event, the event may be withdrawn from the program or combined with another event. A/B events may be combined at Regatta Control's discretion.
- 8. Qualification System: If there are more entrants than lanes available, the event shall be run in divisions. To assist with allocation into divisions, entrants should self-seed their crews by crew number. The best crew should be given #1. If double-digit crew numbers are being used then the second digit is the important one.
- 9. **Maximum number of crews per race:** Generally, races will be limited to a maximum of nine crews, but in most cases eight crews will be raced per race/division.
- 10. **Trophies:** There are no trophies awarded at this regatta. No points will be accrued toward the Karāpiro Trophy at this regatta.
- 11. **Pre-Regatta Safety Briefing:** A pre-regatta safety briefing will be held on Thursday 16 November 2023 at 19:00 via Zoom, using the following <u>LINK</u>. Coaches and participants should refer to Rule 53 of the <u>Rules</u>.
- 12. **Training when the Regatta is Booked by KRI:** No supervised training is available at this regatta due to a preceding lake booking.
- 13. **Approval:** The entry fees and levies have been approved by KRI's membership at the 2023 KRI AGM.
- Boat Types: Boat types that can be entered in this regatta are as published on rowlT.
- Order of Events: As per the separate events list published on rowIT, as approved at the 2023 KRI AGM.

- 16. Closing Date for Entries: Entries close at 10pm on Tuesday 7 November 8am for Day 1 and Wednesday 8 November 8am for Day 2.
- 17. Entry Mode: Entries can only be submitted electronically on the rowIT website (<a href="https://rowit.nz">https://rowit.nz</a>) prior to the closing date and time. No other form of entry will be accepted, either electronic, typed or handwritten unless requested to be so by Regatta Control.
- 18. **Entry Fees:** The following entry fees will be charged **per day** for each of the two one day regattas:

Eights \$18.00 + 15% GST
 Fours / Quads \$16.00 + 15% GST
 Double / Pairs \$14.00 + 15% GST
 Single Sculls \$13.00 + 15% GST
 Amenity Fee \$11.00 + 15% GST

• Seat Levy \$1.20 + 15% GST per sliding seat

## **Regatta Terms and Conditions**

# **Entry Conditions**

### 19. Eligibility and Entry Entities:

- a. Entry to this regatta is open to following organisations (entities):
  - i. all clubs that are members of NZRA
  - ii. all schools that are members of New Zealand Secondary Schools Rowing Association Incorporated (NZSSRA).
- b. Rowers must row in the colours registered to the entity that submitted the entries.
- c. No competitor shall represent more than one entry entity at the regatta, subject to Rule 22.8 of the Rules.
- d. Accounts for fees and penalties will be sent to the entity that submitted the entry in all cases.
- 20. Composite Crews: Local Association composite approvals required by Rule 18.1 of the Rules must be submitted by a Local Association representative by email to regattacontrol@karapirorowing.com or in writing to Regatta Control before the first race of the regatta. KRI will accept from Local Associations blanket season approvals for composite crew entries at KRI regattas as the approvals required by Rule 18.1 of the Rules.

### 21. Entry Restrictions by Event:

- a. The following Rower entry restrictions shall apply to this regatta (before supplementary entries open):
  - i. Each rower is limited to four events.
  - ii. Each rower is restricted to two small boats per rower (pairs excluded).

### 22. Entries:

a. By submitting entries to the regatta, the submitting entity agrees to abide by the:

- NZRA Rules of Racing 2023 and those documents referenced at Rule 6.2 of the Rules, and
- ii. The Constitution of the NZRA where appropriate, and
- iii. The Constitution of Karāpiro Rowing Inc, and
- iv. KRI policies published online, and
- v. these Regatta Terms and Conditions
  and shall pay all charges levied under these Terms and Conditions.
- b. Entries shall include the information required by Rule 42 of the Rules and any other information specified in any applicable forms on rowIT. References to coaching teams (or similar generic names) are not acceptable since Regatta Control must be able to contact a coach for each crew directly.
- c. Entries shall include a record of any medical conditions or allergies that apply to competitors competing in the regatta as required by the form on rowlT. The entry entity shall ensure that this is accurate and up to date for all competing competitors.
- d. Entries shall include accurate information on the swimming ability of each competitor competing as required by the form on rowlT.
- e. Entities will be invoiced for their entries by email after the regatta. The full entry fees are to be paid by direct credit within five (5) days of the date of the invoice.
- f. Payment is by Direct Credit to the account of Karāpiro Rowing Inc at the ASB, Cambridge, account number 12-3268-088115-50 (please ensure account suffix is correct) with invoice number and the entity name supplied as a reference.
- g. Entities who have outstanding fees from previous regattas will not be allowed to submit their entries or have their entries accepted until all arrears are paid.

### 23. Tent Sites:

- a. Tent sites, other than tendered sites, need to be booked as part of the entry process on the rowIT website. These sites will be allocated by random computer draw and are charged at \$55.00 + GST per day for front row sites and \$45.00 + GST per day for back row sites.
- b. Tent allocation will be published three days prior to the start of the regatta.
- c. Tents are only to be erected on allocated sites. Tents erected without permission will be charged for or asked to be removed.
- d. Tents are not allowed to be erected earlier than 4pm on the day preceding the regatta and are to be removed by 8pm on the last day of the booking.
- e. Neither entities nor anyone associated with a tent site shall connect to any fixed power or water source on the domain without the express permission of Karāpiro Rowing Inc. Should you require power this must be booked via rowIT when completing entries. The cost for power is \$100.00 + GST per day.
- 24. **Amenity Fees:** An amenity fee must be paid for each and every competitor who is entered into the regattas as at 8am on Friday 17 November 2023 for Day 1 and at 8am on Saturday 18 November 2023 for Day 2, and for every competitor who is subsequently entered into the regattas (i.e. through any late entries).
- 25. Late Entries: Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of Regatta Control.

26. **Supplementary Entries:** Supplementary Entries may be accepted for this regatta to fill vacant lanes on such terms and conditions as advised at the time of calling for such entries. Entry Restrictions will not apply to Supplementary Entries.

#### 27. Boat Park:

- a. No boats or boat trailers are to be placed in the Boat Park before 12pm (midday) on the day before the regatta under any circumstances.
- b. Boats and trailers are to be removed by 8pm on the last day of the regatta unless pursuant to a private arrangement between the entity and the Mighty River Domain where the entity agrees to pay all charges incurred to the Waipa District Council.
- c. No trailers are to be parked in the Boat Park this season unless authorised in writing by KRI.
- d. The authorisation may take the form of the trailer allocation schedule published by KRI.

# **Post Entry Conditions**

### 28. Substitution of Competitors:

- a. Substitution of crew members can only be done ONLINE on the rowIT website (<u>https://rowit.nz</u>) up until 8am on Friday 17 November 2023 for Day 1 and up until 8am on Saturday 18 November 2023 for Day 2.
- b. An entity making a substitution of crew members after 8am on Friday 17 November 2023 for Day 1 or after 8am on Saturday 18 November 2023 for Day 2 shall make that substitution at the Regatta Secretary's Office at the Control (Judge's) Tower in writing or ONLINE on the rowIT website (<a href="https://rowit.nz">https://rowit.nz</a>) up until 60 minutes prior to the relevant race for the competitor at the regatta.

### 29. Scratchings / Non-Starters:

- a. Scratchings must be notified ONLINE on the rowIT website (<a href="https://rowit.nz">https://rowit.nz</a>) by 8am on Friday 17 November 2023 for Day 1 or by 8am on Saturday 18 November 2023 for Day 2, to avoid incurring a late scratching fee. Entities scratching before this time will receive a refund of 100% of the relevant entry fees.
- b. An entity submitting a scratching after 8am on Friday 17 November 2023 for Day 1 or after 8am on Saturday 18 November 2023 for Day 2 shall make that scratching at the Regatta Secretary's Office at the Control (Judge's) Tower in writing or ONLINE on the rowIT website (<a href="https://rowit.nz">https://rowit.nz</a>) until 60 minutes prior to the race.
- c. Late Scratchings: Scratchings received after 8am on Friday 17 November 2023 for Day 1 or after 8am on Saturday 18 November 2023 for Day 2, and until 60 minutes prior to the race, will be charged a Late Scratching Penalty of \$40 + GST, unless accompanied by medical evidence of a crew member's illness or injury.
- d. Did Not Start: Scratchings received within 60 minutes of the scheduled race start time, or crews that have drawn to start in a race but do not take part in that race will be treated as a Did Not Start, and a penalty of \$60 + GST will be charged to their entities.

## **Race Day Conditions**

30. **Regatta Control:** Shall act as the link between the competitors, crews and coaches and the Race Committee. Regatta Control reserves the right to alter the racing schedule as published, after consulting the Race Committee.

### 31. Racing Colours (uniform):

- a. Rowers are to race in the official colours of the entity that submitted the entries in the case of clubs and schools. Rowers in composite crews are to race in the official colours of the entity they are representing at the regatta.
- b. Club colours are those that are registered with NZRA.
- c. School colours are those that are registered with the NZSSRA.

### 32. Responsibility for Safety and Fitness:

- a. Competitors shall take responsibility for their own health and fitness pursuant to Rule 8 of the Rules.
- b. Entity officials are responsible for every crew from their entity and specifically should ensure:
  - that their crews are aware of their obligations pursuant to Rule 25 of the Rules; and
  - ii. that the competitors are fit to race.
- c. Any continuing concerns as to safety and fitness are to be brought to the attention of the Chief of Control Commission or Boat Marshall or Safety Officer prior to the crew taking to the water.

### 33. Responsibility and Failure to Disclose Medical Information:

- a. Each competitor shall be primarily responsible for ensuring that the entity that submits entries to the regatta shall have up to date information on any medical conditions that the competitors have prior to the close of entries.
- b. Each person who submits entries on behalf of an entity entering the regatta shall:
  - i. ensure that specified medical information about competitors is submitted to KRI by the closing date and time for the entries.
  - ii. where a competitor is diagnosed with a medical condition after the close of entries, the person responsible for the crew shall submit that information to Regatta Control as soon as possible.

### 34. Notification to Regatta Control of Medical Assessments (either On Site or Off Site):

- a. Each competitor by entering this regatta agrees to the First Aid team notifying Regatta Control when the medical services are used by the competitor.
- b. Each competitor entering this regatta agrees to notify Regatta Control (before the competitor next competes) when they have undergone a medical assessment (other than through the On Site First Aid team) and further agrees to provide the results of the assessment. This ensures that Regatta Control is made aware of all medical assessments.
- c. Entities will ensure that each competitor that is assessed by either the on-site first aid team or assessed externally to the regatta and who receives an assessment as being unfit to compete is removed from racing by substituting them out of all crews in which they are entered or scratching all crews in which they are entered or through a combination of scratching and substitution.

#### 35. Lake Use During Regatta:

- a. GREEN Flag the lake is open for racing as directed.
- b. **RED or NO Flag** the lake is closed to **all regatta participants**. A regatta participant for the purpose of this clause is a person whose name appears as an entrant (coach or rower) in the official regatta entry records.
- c. Coach boats or non-rowing boats no coach boats or other non-rowing boats are allowed on the water at any time during the regatta without the express permission of the Chief Umpire.

#### 36. Water Traffic Rules:

- a. The traffic rules for training and racing are as displayed at the Number's Hut. The traffic rules must be strictly complied with.
- b. During racing, all crews must always proceed to the start as directed and remain outside the course until called in for the start of that crew's race.
- c. No crew may cross the course except at the start when called in to race or as specifically directed by an official.

### 37. Coxswains:

- a. Coxswains shall weigh in pursuant to Rule 22.5(a)(i) of the Rules, provided that a coxswain who weighs in on Saturday 18 November 2023 in compliance with Rule 22.5(a)(i) will be considered to have also weighed in on Sunday 19 November 2023 in compliance with that Rule (i.e. a coxswain who weighs in on the Saturday does not need to weigh in again on the Sunday).
- b. Coxswains will not wear heavy cotton or woolen clothing (such as jeans, sweaters or sweatshirts) but suitable clothing that will keep them warm (e.g., poly-props, polar fleeces, etc.) such that in an event of capsize or sinking, the water will not render the clothing a hazard.

### c. Life-jackets:

- Coxswains must comply with Rule 22.7 of the <u>Rules</u> or must wear a non-inflatable buoyancy aid which is substantially compliant with New Zealand Standards (NZS 5823:2005), suitable for their size and age and/or weight, and outside all other clothing.
- Lifejackets must be in good condition and have in a legible state, the manufacturer's label and certification intact.
- iii. Under no circumstances are inflatable (either manual or automatic) lifejackets to be worn by coxswains during the regatta.

### 38. Boat Numbers:

- a. Crews without a number will not be allowed onto the water. If a crew loses their number on the way to the start they should inform a Race Official immediately.
- b. Numbers not returned will be charged at \$25 + GST per instance.
- A crew that crosses the finish line with an incorrect bow number may be excluded.
- 39. **Boat Safety Standards:** It is a matter of prime importance that all boats must be in a safe condition for rowing. Crews are responsible for this pursuant to Rule 25 of the Rules. Race Officials (or other persons so appointed by the Regatta Organising Committee) will conduct boat safety compliance checks and all boats that pass the compliance check will have a sticker attached to the bow of the boat. Boats not displaying a sticker shall not be permitted to take to the water.

- 40. Postponement or Cancellation: The Regatta Organising Committee shall be under no obligation to refund any fees whatsoever because of the postponement or cancellation of the regatta for whatsoever reason. Rowing is an outdoor sport and as such is subject to the weather being suitable on any given day to conduct the regatta in a safe and responsible manner.
- 41. Compliance with Part 101 of the CAA Rules: Pursuant to Rule 101.207(a)(1)(i) participation in this regatta either as a competitor or as an official or volunteer shall be deemed to be consent to be under any unmanned or remotely piloted aircraft operated by KRI or any of its agents or contractors.
- 42. **Photography:** By entering this regatta under these conditions entities agree to having photographs, videos and/or other images taken of their competitors, supporters, volunteers, coaches during the regatta and these may be used for media and promotion purposes in connection with this event or future events and/or Rowing NZ or KRI business. No drones are permitted at this regatta (with the exception of drones operated by or on behalf of KRI for the purpose of live-streaming or similar).
- 43. Exclusion of all Tort Liability of Whatsoever Nature: All due care will be taken by the regatta organisers and officials to ensure the regatta is conducted safely and efficiently. However, it remains the prime and principal responsibility of individuals participating in the regatta (either as rowers, coxswains, coaches, or other entity officials) to conduct themselves in a safe and responsible manner at all times. This includes making sure prior to racing that their boats are safe for racing and generally in compliance with these conditions. Also, that the rowers in each crew are fit for the ordeal of racing. They must also ensure that these conditions are complied with and that the directions of the regatta officials are followed.

Further, it is a condition of participation in this regatta that all participants accept and note that no liability either in tort or any other nature whatsoever, is accepted by or will attach to the NZRA or KRI for any harm, damage, loss, costs, expenses, inconvenience, interference, of whatever nature and whatever kind, including any damage to equipment or injury to persons of whatever nature incurred in the course of, or in connection with, or in any way related to the regatta, regardless of whether any omission, wrongdoing, oversight, negligence, or other tort whatsoever on the part of any regatta official, or other person may be established.
